2016 Fall Tree Planting City Wide Application

The Department of Public Works proudly announces the **2016 Fall Tree Planting**. In an effort to make Jersey City a Cleaner & Greener place, we are offering **3" to 3 1/2" caliper trees** for **\$200.00 dollars**.

Ordering Instructions & Information:

1. **Ordering deadline October 1st, 2016**
2. Trees will only be planted along curb line adjacent to owners property. No private property requests please.
3. When ordering remember recommendation that trees be planted twenty feet (20') apart and five feet (5') from utilities.
4. Final planting location will be determined by the Director of Park Maintenance or his designee.
If you have a preferred location you may note it below in comments. Preferred location may be changed if utilities or other considerations warrant such action.
5. **Tree supply is limited and orders will be filled on a first come first served basis.**
6. Property owners are responsible for watering trees. (See accompanying instructions.)
7. **Gator (Watering) Bags** are optional for **\$15 Dollars per bag**.



| <p>Acer Campestre / Hedge Maple</p> <p>Maturity 20 - 35 Ft Height 25 - 35 Ft Spread</p> | <p>This is a small, low-branched, dense, rounded, deciduous tree or large multi-stemmed shrub that typically grows in cultivation to 25-35' tall.</p> |  |
| <p>Ginkgo Biloba/ Maidenhair Tree/ Princeton Sentry</p> <p>Maturity 50 - 65 Ft Height 15 - 20 Ft Spread</p> <p>Not Recommended under wires.</p> | <p>An excellent form of upright Ginkgo, tapering slightly from the base to the top. Good yellow fall color. Fruitless.</p> |  |
| <p>European Hornbeam/ Carpinus</p> <p>Maturity 40 - 60 Ft Height 20 - 30 Ft Spread</p> <p>Not Recommended under wires.</p> | <p><i>Carpinus betulus</i> commonly called European hornbeam is a medium-sized, deciduous tree that grows 40-60' (less frequently to 80') tall with a pyramidal to oval-rounded crown. Ovate, sharply-toothed, dark green leaves (to 5" long) are clean and attractive throughout the growing season with little susceptibility to foliar diseases.</p> |  |
| <p>Gleditsia/ Streetkeeper HoneyLocust</p> <p>Maturity 25 - 45 Ft Height 20 - 25 Ft Spread</p> | <p>An ideal tree for city streets, this cultivar boasts the tight, narrow form that has long been lacking in urban tolerant honeylocust. The ascending branch structure gives Street Keeper® a canopy that is only half as wide as other cultivars. Foliage is deeper green than other selections</p> |  |

| <p>Prunus Hillieri Spire Cherry</p> <p>Maturity 25 - 30 Ft Height 10 Ft Spread</p> | <p>Spire Cherry is a slender, upright tree, columnar when young but fanning out slightly as it ages. It has small, soft pink single flowers in April with red eyes. The pinkish bronze leaves are unfurling at the same time, so the effect is pink at a distance and, close up, full of charming detail.</p> |  |
| <p>Prunus / Okame Cherry</p> <p>Maturity 15 - 20 Ft Height 20 - 30 Ft Spread</p> | <p>Compact upright form. Bright pink blooms in Spring. Orange-red Fall color.</p> |  |
| <p>Halesia/ Crushed Velvet</p> <p>Maturity 15 - 20 Ft Height 10 - 15 Ft Spread</p> | <p>Halesia, Crushed Velvet Silverbell, is a compact form of the Carolina Silverbell. The bluish green leaves have a wavy texture which is reminiscent of crushed velvet (the inspiration for the name). The smaller leaf size and fine textured branching combined with the velvety foliage create a plush appearance and a lovely backdrop for the spring blooming, white bell-shaped flowers. This compact tree grows only 20' tall by 15' spread</p> |  |
| <p>Zelkova Serrata/ Japanese Zelkova - Musashino</p> <p>Maturity 35 - 45 Ft Height 15 - 20 Ft Spread</p> <p>Not Recommended under wires.</p> | <p>An upright vase shaped Zelkova from Japan. Fast growing; dusty red fall color.</p> |  |

WATER

Watering is the most important concern for a new tree. Each tree needs 20 gallons of water a week between May and October. Water slowly so none runs off into the street.

WEEDS

All weeds should be hand removed fully. Avoid using chemical weed killer. Removal in early fall will reduce chance of weeds returning.

GARBAGE

Remove litter and pet waste from tree pit as often as possible.

TREE PIT

Use a hand cultivator to loosen the to 2-3 inches of soil to remove compaction. Do not let soil level rise or lower from the original level. Maintain 3" of mulch 6" away from the trunk. Keep de-icing salt away from the tree pit as often as possible.

PLANTING

If desired, planting annuals and bulbs is permitted; remember tree health comes first. Use "drought tolerant" plants to avoid over watering the tree. Never plant woody shrubs or vines in your tree pit. Do not add extra soil to the tree pit, maintain original level.
